Police Department Report-Meth, drugs, stolen goods, and a person locked in the American Legion were main issues.

-The Police Committee has asked for a hiring application to be completed by Garry Jones.

Fire Department Report-State Fire Marshall will help get dilapidated homes/buildings torn down if we will send him pics and a letter.

-FD is short over \$14,000 to purchase two new boat motors. Fundraiser brought in not quite half of the needed money.

Water & Sewer Report-Lost power and blew a fuse during big March 3rd rain.

-Pharmacy line from meter in need of replacement.

Streets & Park Report-David Hardin says ditch filled up and water got in home.

Gas Dept Report-Account looking much better.

TIF Report- Committee met and decided not to give any money to individuals or businesses. Some misunderstandings were hashed out and that now may not be the recommendation by all committee members.

-Housing Authority to give City of Shawneetown 6 lots to be used for new park located between W. Logan and W. Wilson Ave.and butting up against Lincoln Blvd.

Old Business-

- 1. Liquor Ordinance-add one line and then sign next month.
- 2. Employee evaluations-2 times a year. WIll start this week.
- 3. Illinois Vehicle Code Ordinance-No update
- 4. Cameras-cost includes taxes; will be lower at purchase
 - a. Phase I to be \$3,163 for City Hall and FD. Real-time
 - b. Phase II to be \$4,074 for Park and Maint. Bldg

New Business

- 1. Mowing bids-Call insurance about high voltage and lagoon. Meet again after insurance questions.
 - a. Steve Dunk \$1,800 weekly including spray
 - b. Kenny Hewitt \$7,000 monthly
 - c. Audie Goebel \$1,220 weekly; \$325 per spray as needed
- 2. Side by side crossing-Garry should give tickets for crossings anywhere but McClain.
 - a. \$50 to get sticker for side by side by end of April
 - b. \$75 to get a sticker if purchased in May or later.
- 3. Saline Valley increased water price from \$3.49/1,000 gallon to \$3.77/1,000 gallons.
 - a. 8% increase overall. Will need to increase minimum charge 8% as well as water prices in computer program.
- 4. 2nd police officer-when the application is finished, it will be published.
- 5. Easter Egg Hunt-On mall April 1st. Motion by Lisa Smith and 2nd by Sheryl Scherrer to donate \$1,000 from the COVID fund to the Egg Hunt for prizes. Motion passed.
- 6. State Records-Retention office to return in April to let us know what we can shred. Has not been done since 1993.
- 7. Motion to go into Closed Session to discuss salaries and positions by Lisa Smith, 2nd by Sheryl Scherrer. Motion passed. Closed session entered at 8:20 PM
- 8. Motion to return from closed session by Brandon Vickery, 2nd by Sheryl Scherrer. Motion passed. Return from closed session at 9:07 PM
- 9. Motion by Brandon Vickery, 2nd by June Rushing to take \$14,500 out of COVID account to pay for 2 motors for Fire Dept boat. Motion passed.
